### Moraleda Pole Bean

**55 Day. Pole.** An early-maturing variety that produces uniform, 5½-6" round pods with good flavor and attractive, dark green color. High-yielding plants perform well in dry, low-fertility soils and have an extended harvest window to keep you picking longer. Shows high resistance to bean common mosaic virus and anthracnose.

### Zenzei Hybrid Tomato

**70-80 Day. Indeterminate. Paste. 2023 AAS Regional Winner** (Great Lakes & Heartland). High-yielding, disease-resistant plants produce loads of 4-5" long fruits that average 3-8 ounces each. Deep red and meaty, these tomatoes are great for sauces, salsas, freezing, canning and fresh eating. Ideal for smaller gardens and beginner gardeners as it has a bushy habit that requires staking but no special pruning.

54 Day. Bush Bean. In our summer trial garden, we found this bean to be superior in every way. The upright plants outyielded comparison varieties, producing loads of  $5\frac{1}{2}$ -6" dark green, flavorful pods, even during hot and dry conditions. Resistant to rust, curly top virus and bean common mosaic virus. Perfect for home canning, pickling and freezing.

### Zephyr Hybrid Summer Squash

**54 Day. Summer Squash.** A novel variety, prolific plants produce slender yellow fruits with light green blossom ends. Best harvested at 4-6", the fruits have a delectable nutty flavor and firm texture. Hot weather can sometimes produce variability in appearance, but the flavor will remain superb.

### **Racer Plus Hybrid Pumpkin**

**85 Day. Carving.** An early-maturing variety with shorter vines ideal for smaller gardens. Each plant will produce 2-3 rich orange, ribbed fruits averaging 14-18 pounds each. Sturdy, dark green handles are well attached, making this a great choice for home gardens and pumpkin patches.

### **BUSH BEAN CULTURE**

After all danger of frost, plant seed in rows 18-24" apart. Make furrows about 2" deep and space the beans 2" apart in the row. Cover with soil and firm it down, but do not pack it too tight over the seed. A packet will plant approximately 20-30' of row. For best results, inoculate beans at planting with Nature's Aid<sup>™</sup> Rhizobia Inoculant (see page 2). Shipments of bean, pea, cowpea, soybean and other legume seeds to the state of ldaho are intended for home gardens only. These seeds cannot be resold for any other purpose.

### Accelerate

**54 Day. Bush. PVP.** A great variety for the home gardener, this bean was developed at the University of Wisconsin and was selected for its heavy yield and disease resistance. The medium-green pods are 6-7" in length and are borne evenly on the plant. Although it starts producing early, it remains productive throughout the season.

### Annihilator

**53 Day. Bush. PVP.** These easy-care plants have an excellent disease-resistance package and require less nitrogen than other varieties, allowing for success in poor soils. Pods are set high on the plant for easy harvest and maintain their high quality longer than other beans.

### Contender

Also tolerant of mildew and other diseases. Matures over a short period of time, so you can complete your canning or freezing quickly.

### **Purple Queen Improved**

### **BEAN PLANT HABITS**

Bush Beans have a compact growth habit and do not require support or trellising. In general, they mature earlier than pole beans with a large first harvest and a smaller second flush.

Pole Beans have a vining or climbing habit and require trellising. Most mature later than bush beans and produce over a longer period of time.

### French Bean Slicer

French slice beans perfectly. Heavy-duty slicer clamps to counter or table. Easily slices 2-3 beans lengthwise at a time. Easy to clean. #83031 \$32.95



### POLE BEAN CULTURE

Plant 1" deep in hills 3' apart each way, 5 or 6 beans in a hill, then set 6' high rough poles into each hill. When plants are established, thin to 3 or 4 of the strongest plants in each hill. If you plant in rows, space seeds 4" apart in rows 2' apart and use our Trellis Netting for vine support (see page 6). Stake the netting every 3' to prevent sagging. Pick frequently, as pole beans are prolific and will continue to bear until frost.

### Kentucky Blue

**57 Day. Pole. 1991 AAS Winner.** Delicious, sweet flavor and incredible yields. Healthy, vigorous plants produce an abundance of 6-7" green pods that are round and straight. Developed from the well-known Kentucky Wonder and Blue Lake varieties. Resistant to some rust strains and bean common mosaic virus.

### **Exactly Housewife**

**75-80 Day. Pole.** This triple purpose pole bean can be used as a snap, shell (90 days) or dry bean depending on when you harvest, and was one of the first to be completely stringless. For these reasons, it is well suited to the "lazy," because there is little work or timing involved. Medium-green pods are 4-5" long with distinctive shiny white seeds.

### **Monte Cristo**

**71 Day. Pole.** If you like Monte Gusto, you're going to love Monte Cristo! The vigorous vines produce an abundance of stringless, meaty beans from mid-July until frost and its outstanding bean flavor can be enjoyed fresh, cooked or preserved. The plants are resistant to bean common mosaic virus and anthracnose.

### Monte Gusto

**70-80 Day. Pole.** One of the finest quality yellow pods on a pole bean. This yellow wax bean boasts attractive, brightly colored pods that are incredibly flavorful. Beans are best harvested at 7" when they are bursting with outstanding flavor. Uniform beans have a great texture, produce over a long period of time and can grow up to 6' tall, so make sure to provide adequate support.

### **Purple Podded Pole**

**63-65 Day. Pole.** Attractive plants and tasty pods make this an edibleornamental. Impressive 6' vines with a purple hue yield lovely violet flowers and large, stringless, meaty, reddish purple, 5-7" pods with a green interior. Found by Henry Fields in an Ozark garden in the 1930s, and grown by generations of gardeners ever since. We prefer the flavor when the seeds are just starting to form in the pod. Light green when cooked.

### Stringless Blue Lake S-7

**60 Day. Pole. 2003 AAS Winner.** An early maturing variety that has sparse foliage for easy picking. The 6-61/2" pods are borne on spurs extending out from the vine. Plants are very productive. ### **Borsalino**

**60 Day. Bush. French Filet.** Round, straight, 4-5" beans turn an attractive bright yellow quickly and completely, making them easy to locate throughout the bushy plant. The heavy set of tender, tasty, stringless beans makes them well suited for hand harvesting and home gardens. Borsalino was a flavor favorite in out test garden. Enjoy the crisp, incredible flavor fresh or lightly steamed.

### Calima

**55 Day. Bush. French Filet.** Early maturing and High-yielding. This bean is a nice dark green color with very good flavor. Harvest when pods are about the diameter of a pencil. ### Emerite

### Fortex

**60 Day. Pole. French Filet.** Perhaps the best-eating green bean, fresh or frozen. Vigorous vines produce loads of extra-long pods to over 11". They may be picked young at 7" for extra slender, super tender filet beans. At any size, the round pods are dark green, firm, completely stringless and delicious, even after the seeds get big. Brown seeded.

### Masai

**55 Day. Bush. French Filet.** Quite popular in Europe, flavorful, 4" pods have a nice green color and tender texture. Borne on small-leaved bushes, the beans are concentrated in the upper half of the plant, making them easy to pick. Very disease-resistant. Can be grown in container gardens as well as in-ground. White seeded.

### Maxibel

**57 Day. Bush. French Filet.** A fancy-type classic French filet bean with dark green pods 7½" long and only ¼" in diameter. Flavorful and attractive black beans fill the pods all season long. Best yet, it's stringless!

### Velour

**50-55 Day. Bush. French Filet.** The attractive purple color is only one of its desirable characteristics. Medium sized, upright, bushy plants are resistant to bean common mosaic virus and halo blight.

### FLAT PODDED BEANS

### Capitano

**62 Day. Bush. Romano.** You won't find a prettier creamy-yellow Romano bean. Plus, Capitano beans have a delicious, full flavor and a smooth, tender, stringless texture. The pods, which are  $4\frac{1}{2}-5$ " long and  $\frac{1}{2}$ " across, shower the upright, bushy plants with heavy crops of the tasty beans. Pods exhibit their golden color, even when small. White seeded.

### **Dow Purple Pod**

**75-80 Day. Pole. Romano.** A scarce variety, said to have originated in Illinois. A vigorous climber, vines reach up to 6' and produce 7-8" flat pods with a rich purple exterior that starkly contrasts with the bright green interior. Pods will turn green when cooked. Good germination even in cool, wet soils.

### Firdaouss

**55 Day. Pole. Romano.** This early-maturing variety produces uniform, straight, 7-8½" flat-podded green beans that have good flavor and are slow to develop seeds. Healthy plants are highly resistant to bean common mosaic virus and set well in both hot and cold conditions, offering a high yield potential.

### Hilda

**60 Day. Pole. Romano.** Nothing beats the flavor of these deep green, stringless beans. The plants exhibit good heat and disease resistance, and produce incredibly large quantities of flat-podded, 10-12" beans. Vigorous vines require a trellis or Bean Tower (see page 5) for best results.

### Marvel of Venice

### Northeaster

**56 Day. Pole. Romano.** This vigorous pole bean, with its strong vines, can withstand the elements. Among the earliest of the Romano types, Northeaster's massive beans, 8" long and 1" wide, are pleasantly sweet and stringless. The pods stay tender for extended periods, giving the home gardener time to savor the flavor. White seeded.

### Roma II

**54 Day. Bush. Romano.** A bush version of the popular Italian pole bean. Pods are 5-6" long, thick, flat, medium green and stringless. Bushy 18" plants are very productive. Its distinctive flavor is equally good when used as a snap or a green shell bean. Highly recommended for freezing.

### **BROAD BEAN CULTURE**

Also known as fava beans, the broad bean is a cool-season crop that will not set pods when temperatures climb above 70°F. It is essential to get seeds in the ground as soon as soil can be worked in the spring. Plant 1" deep, 4-6" apart in rows 18-30" apart. **Caution: Persons of Mediterranean descent have a genetic trait which may cause an allergic reaction to fava beans.** 

### **Broad Windsor**

**85 Day. Bush. Broad or Fava.** Plants are true bush form and heavy yielders. Glossy green, 7" pods contain 5-7 large, oblong, light green beans. Pick at 2-3" to eat like snap beans or use as a tasty shell bean. Very sweet flavor similar to a pea. Edible young leaves may be added to salads as a nutritional spring green.

### **DRY & SHELL BEAN HARVEST TIP**

Well-known as a powerhouse of nutrition, beans can also be a foundation for imaginative dishes. Abundant with soluble fiber, they combine well with grains. They are virtually fat-free, have no cholesterol and are a source of vitamins. The mild flavor makes them perfect partners with spices and herbs.

Harvest shell beans when seeds are fully formed in the pod, but pods are still soft and green. Dry bean pods should be allowed to dry down until brown and brittle. Seeds sold are intended for planting and not for consumption. Color may vary depending on maturity.





### **ASPARAGUS CULTURE**

The secret to asparagus longevity is soil prep and ditch-digging. Plants will provide for decades if done correctly. We recommend planting 10-15 roots for every person in your household. Asparagus does best in soil with a pH range of 6.5-7.5. Use a soil analyzer (see left) to test the soil. Dig a trench 8-10" deep and 12" wide. Mix removed soil with compost, aged manure and superphosphate. Fill trench with  $\frac{3}{4}$  of mixture. Spread asparagus roots out over mix and cover with 2-3" of remaining mix. Water in well. ### BEET CULTURE

As soon as the soil can be worked, plant seed 1/2" deep and 1-2" apart in rows 18-24" apart. Allow 1-2 weeks for germination. Thin plants to 3-4" apart. For a continuous supply, plant every 2 weeks up until 60 days before first frost. Use later plantings for winter storage. One ounce contains 800-1,200 seeds and sows a 100' row.



### **CONTAINER GARDENING**

With most of our population in urban areas, container and small-space gardens are a solution for those looking to enjoy fresh produce. The items on this page have been bred specifically to maintain smaller plant sizes while still producing adequate yields of tasty, healthy vegetables. For best results, we suggest using containers at least 24" wide, that are deep with good drainage holes. Fill containers with fresh, well-drained, pre-moistened potting soil. Watering must be monitored closely. Never let the soil dry completely, and avoid getting the foliage wet when watering. Regular fertilization with veggie-appropriate, water-soluble food (2-4-2) is necessary to keep plants well fed. Although these plants are compact, trellises and supports are recommended for some items and when fruit set is abundant.





### SWEET CORN CULTURE

Plant corn in rows – at least 4 rows side by side for each variety – to get full pollination. Plant rows 21/2-3' apart, spacing the seeds 4-6" apart. Thin early varieties to 10-12" apart; later varieties to 15-18" apart. Our seed is untreated, so be sure the soil has warmed up to a minimum of 60°F before planting to ensure good germination. To give untreated seeds a quicker start, boost the moisture content by pre-soaking them in lukewarm water for 8 hours or overnight, then planting them immediately the next day. Pre-soaking can aid in earlier and better uniformity of emergence when planted in warm soils. A packet plants approximately 50-70' of row.

### SUGARY (su) SWEET CORN

Sugary, or normal, sweet corn varieties (su) offer traditional, oldfashioned flavor. The sugars convert more quickly to starch, so ears must be harvested as soon as they are ripe and used quickly. Isolate from sh2 and synergistic corns.

### JERUSALEM ARTICHOKE CULTURE

Grow Jerusalem Artichokes in full sun in well-drained soil. Plant whole tubers or cut larger ones into pieces with 2-3 eyes. Dig furrow 4" deep and space tubers 12-18" apart with 3' between rows. When shoots emerge, mound soil around plants. Harvest after first frost. Ships March through mid May at the right planting time for your area. Cannot ship to: AK, HI.

### Jerusalem Artichoke

Unusual, nutty flavor, with water chestnut texture. Eat raw in salads, or add to Asian foods at the last minute of cooking. Can be cooked like potatoes for a starch substitute. Excellent for diets - only 8 calories per 4 ounce serving. They grow and store like potatoes. Plants grow 6-10' tall and 3-5' wide. Blooms August through September. #1 grade tubers.

### **KOHLRABI CULTURE**

As soon as the soil can be worked, sow 1 seed per inch, 1/2" deep, in rows 18" apart, thinning to 6" apart. Allow 2 weeks for germination. When the bottom of the stem has reached 2-3" in diameter, it is ready for harvest.






# MELONS Cantaloupes/Muskmelons .















### HARVEST TIP

Melons will "slip" from the vine when ripe, which means the vine naturally detaches. We suggest harvesting at "half-slip" to prevent overripeness. Apply slight pressure at the vine and the melon should detach with a slight tug. Melons reach peak sugar content about 1 week from maturity. Cultural consistency during this period is critical for optimum flavor. Near maturity, excessive rain or irrigation can mute melon flavor.

### CANTALOUPE/MUSKMELON CULTURE

After all danger of frost and when the soil temperature reaches 60°F, sow directly into the garden. Sow 6-8 seeds 1" deep in hills that are 6-8' apart (crowded vines will not yield well). Allow 12-14 days for germination. When plants are established, thin to 3-4 of the strongest plants. Aged manure mixed into the bottom of each hill helps stimulate growth. Excess nitrogen in summer induces vines to produce only male flowers. Female flowers make fruits.

### Ambrosia Hybrid

86 Day. Our flavor favorite. Luscious, super sweet melon has extra thick, firm, super juicy, salmon-colored flesh. Vigorous, productive vines produce mediumsized, smooth, slightly oval, heavily netted fruits that weigh up to 5 pounds. Powdery mildew resistant.

Days to maturity are listed from time of transplant.

**Seedless** varieties require a pollenizer. Each packet includes 5 additional seeds of another variety to cross-pollinate and should be planted in an alternating pattern with the seedless variety. Fruits from the pollenizer have a contrasting rind color pattern for easy identification.



Each bulblet will multiply during the growing season to form a cluster of 6 or more new bulbs depending on soil fertility. Harvest when tops fall and begin to turn brown. ### **ONION SEEDS & PLANTS**

Plants are quicker to produce than seeds or sets, with scallions ready for the table in 3-4 weeks, mature bulbs in 4 months. Depending on plant size, one bunch contains an average of 40-50 plants and is enough to plant a 20' row. Plants are field grown, harvested fresh and bundled with care to arrive safely. 



### **PARSNIP CULTURE**

Sow in mid spring in a well-prepared bed with deep, loose soil. Plant seed ¾" deep and 1" apart in rows 18" apart. Allow 3 weeks for germination, then thin to 6" apart. Parsnips are sweetened by frost and can remain in the ground to be harvested over the winter if properly mulched with hay or straw.

### **Albion Hybrid**

**120 Day.** This long, tapered root has excellent creamy texture and slightly spicysweet flavor. Grows well in most soil types. This variety is heavy yielding and is suitable for early-to main-season sowing.
















As soon as the soil can be worked, sow directly into the garden. Plant 2-3 times at 1-week intervals. Plant again in late summer for a fall crop. Sow seeds 2" apart at the depth of 1-2". Before covering with soil, sprinkle Nature's Aid™ Rhizobia Inoculant (see below) over the seed. Space rows 2-21/2' apart, support with our Bean & Pea Fence (see below) or our Bean & Pea Tower (see page 5). A packet will plant approximately 25' of row.

Alternate spacing: Plant in double rows spaced 3-6" apart with 20-24" between double rows.





### PEPPER CULTURE

Seed germinates best in warm soils (75-85°F). Start indoors in flats 8-10 weeks prior to last frost date. Plant seed 1/2" deep, 1" apart and place flats on a seedling heat mat (see page 47). Allow 2-4 weeks for germination. Transplant when plants have at least 3 sets of true leaves. Transplant into the garden when night temperatures are consistently over 50°F. Space plants 2' apart in rows 3' apart. Maturity dates are from the time of transplanting into the garden.

### SWEET PEPPERS

### **Big Bertha Hybrid**

73 Day. Sweet. One of the largest bell peppers available. Blocky, elongated bell, 6-7" long and 4" wide with 3-4 lobes and thick, meaty walls. A delicious, sweet pepper when harvested glossy green, or for the sweetest flavor, wait until they turn deep, high-gloss red. Excellent stuffed, but one will be enough for two people. Tobacco mosaic virus resistant.

### POTATO CULTURE

Homegrown just tastes better! We have listed some of the best varieties for home gardeners and are sure you will agree. The potatoes you receive are Certified Seed Potatoes grown free of diseases. They are cleaned, bagged and ready for you to cut to size for planting. Potatoes sold are intended for planting and not consumption. We begin shipping potatoes in April as weather permits.

Cutting Tips: Cut pieces should be no smaller than 1" x 1" and have at least two eyes. After pieces are cut, allow them to callus over at room temperature with good air circulation for 5 -10 days prior to planting.

Planting Tips: Potatoes do best in soil with a pH of 5.0 to 5.5. Add all necessary soil amendments prior to planting. Dig a furrow 8-10" deep and place pieces cut side down, eyes up, every 12-15" with rows 3' apart. Initially cover pieces with only 2-3" of soil, back filling as potatoes start to grow, leaving the top 3" of the plant exposed. Cannot ship to: AK, FL, HI.

#### Fingerling Salad

Late Season. Popular heirloom variety brought to the U.S. by early German settlers. Medium-sized, 2-4" finger-like tubers have smooth, buff-yellow skin and light yellow interiors. Unique flavor with a waxy texture. Stores well.

#### **German Butterball**

Late Season. Creamy, tender, yellow flesh has a buttery flavor that lends itself to a variety of uses. Great for mashed or baked potatoes, hashbrowns, fries and more. 

Small World of Color Blend

Plant after all danger of frost, when soil is warm. Plant 5-6 seeds in hills 6-8' apart. When seedlings are well-started, thin to the strongest 2 plants in each hill. If you are trying to grow very large pumpkins, remove all but 2 or 3 flowers from the vines. The best flowers to leave are the 4th or 5th and then one a little further down the vine. The vines will then put all their energy into the 2 or 3 remaining.

### Connecticut Field

**120 Day. Dual Purpose.** This heirloom variety is a very popular jack-o'-lantern pumpkin. Fruits are large, smooth and bright golden orange, weigh 15-25 pounds or more, and are slightly flattened at both ends, so they don't tip. Can also be used for pies or canning.

#### **Dill's Atlantic Giant**

### TOMATO CULTURE

Sow in flats 6-8 weeks prior to transplanting outdoors. Soil temperature should be 75-85°F. Plant seed ¼" deep, allowing 8-11 days for germination. When plants are 1-1½" tall, transplant into Jiffy<sup>®</sup> Pots (see page 46). Transplant outdoors 3-4' apart when nighttime temperatures stay above 50°F. Maturity dates are from the time of transplanting into the garden.

Indeterminate or climbing tomato plants are larger with more widely spaced branches which continue to vine after fruit has formed. Consequently, tomatoes ripen and can be harvested over a longer period of time. These plants should be both staked and pruned.

**Determinate** or **bush** tomato plants produce many short branches and grow only moderately after the fruits have formed. These compact plants have a concentrated fruit set and often do not require staking, unless desired to lift tomatoes off wet ground.
